Dear Minister,

A Plan of Action for Salmon and Sea Trout in Wales - Tackling the 'Salmonid Emergency'

We write as a collective of fisheries and conservation NGOs, regarding NRW's *Plan of Action for Salmon and Sea Trout in Wales*, launched in April 2020.

Salmon and sea trout are of enormous importance to Wales. Both species have ecological, conservational and economic significance, and are peerless indicators of the health of our rivers, betraying the condition of the land through which they flow. As the Plan describes and depicted below in Appendix 1, the status of Wales's salmon and sea trout stocks has declined dramatically in recent times, with worryingly little improvement predicted within the next four years. Therefore, the need for the Plan is without doubt and we broadly welcome it.

However, for the aspirations of the Plan to be realised, it is imperative that Welsh Government recognises fully and demonstrates the will to address the multiplicity of factors affecting the health of the country's rivers and its salmon and sea trout populations, including the role and repeated impact of increasingly intensive forms of agriculture. Addressing these issues will be no small undertaking and we would therefore urge Welsh Government to ensure that the Plan and its implementation through the detailed Forward Delivery Plan are adequately funded to ensure that Government meets its national and international obligations towards these two keystone species.

We look forward to working with both Welsh Government and NRW, contributing towards the success of the Plan and the return of thriving populations of salmon and sea trout to the rivers of Wales.
