## What's expected from me as a SmartRivers volunteer?

training

You will need to participate in two days of training. These may be consecutive or split up.

The first day is in sampling technique, where you learn how to 'kick-sweep' and how to divvy up your 3 minute sampling time based on the habitat proportions at your site.

The second day you will learn invertebrate identification skills, tailored to the invertebrates expected in your river.

#### sampling

You will need to sample twice a year at the designated sample sites.

There are usually five sites to cover, within your group you will decide who samples where. Samples are collected in spring and autumn, usually in May and September.

### <u>analysis</u>

You will need to preserve your samples and either get them ready for posting or start analysis (depending on the pathway your hub lead has chosen).

If analysing yourself you will be begin the sorting and ID processes outlined in your training courses.

## quality control

You will need to keep your samples (both substrate and animals in separate containers!) if doing your own identification, until the quality control sample has been selected.

We'll organise with your hub lead collection of this sample for an entomologist check and provide feedback to improve your skills.
